*Choose from 2 options for different layouts (primary/intermediate) for back cover.

1. Title Page: Draw the cover of your book, or make a new cover of your own! (Two layout options)

2. Characters & Traits: Draw your main characters and write one trait about each person.

3. Setting: Draw the main setting of the story.

4. Plot: Primary Option: Draw a picture and write a summary of the beginning, middle, and end of the story.
Intermediate Option: Conflict, Rising Action, Climax, Falling Action, Resolution

5. Making Connections: Write a text-to-text, text-to-self, or text-to-world connection you made with this book.

6. Theme/Lessons Learned:

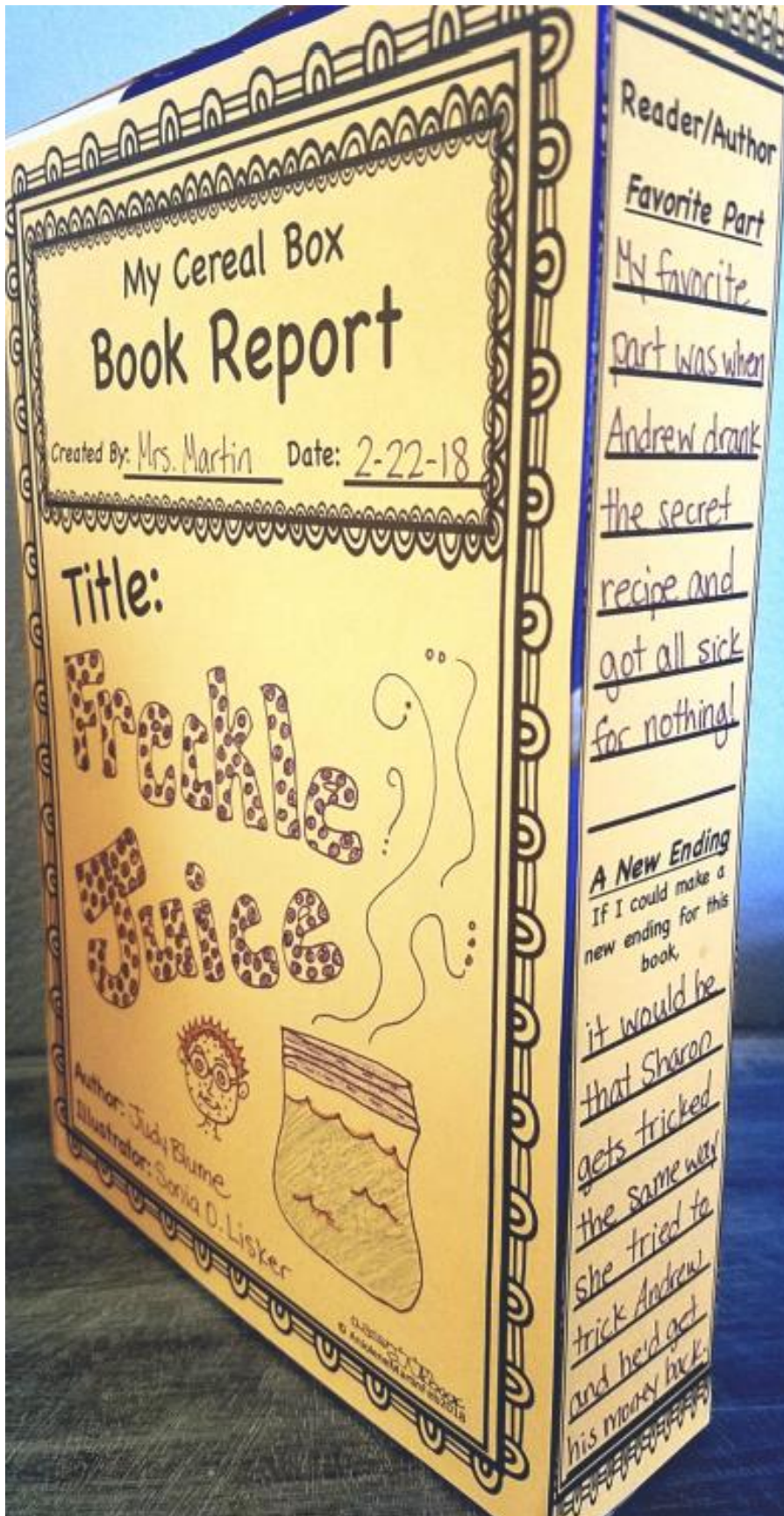
