

Summer Reading Project for Incoming Fifth Graders



Dear Parents/Guardians of Incoming Fifth Graders,

This summer, your child will be expected to read at least one of the 2023-2024 Sunshine State books from the attached list. After reading their one book of choice, students must complete a summer reading book project for a grade. The book report project that the Fifth Grade students should complete is a "Book Report Mobile Hanger."

The supplies needed are:

- One wire hanger
- Ribbon, string, or thick thread
- Notecards, index cards, or card stock
- Hole puncher and tape or stapler
- Scissors, markers, crayons, glitter

Mobile Hanger Instructions

Each index card should have as follows:

- **Top of the hanger** should have a card with the title of the book, author, and genre on one side, and the student's name on the other side.
- **Setting Index Card** should have an <u>illustration of the main setting</u> of the book on one side, and a <u>written description of the setting</u> on the other side.
- Main Character Index Card should have an <u>illustration of the main character</u> on one side. The other side should have a <u>written description</u> of who the character is and explain why the character is important to the story.
- Secondary Characters Index Card should have an <u>illustration of other important characters</u> in the story on one side, and a <u>written description of important character traits</u> demonstrated throughout the story on the other side.
- **Summary Index Card** should be a <u>handwritten summary</u> of the story. This should take up <u>both sides</u> of the card and should include the conflict and resolution of the story.
- **Theme Index Card** should have the <u>theme</u>, <u>lesson</u>, <u>or message</u> of the story on one side, and should <u>explain what you learned</u> from the story on the other side.
- Rating Index Card should have a <u>star rating</u> from 1 to 5 on one side. On the other side, you should <u>write an explanation</u> on why you would or would not recommend this book to your classmates.

This project will be due on Friday, August 25, 2023. We urge your child to be ORIGINAL and CREATIVE since this will be their first required assignment for their 5th grade reading class. In addition, during the first two weeks of school, your child will take an Accelerated Reader quiz on the book that they selected. The mobile hanger presentation, the handwritten index cards, and the Accelerated Reader quiz score will be their first Reading and Language Arts grades for the school year.


Mobile Hanger Book Project Rubric

This project is worth three grades. The grades are as follows: Two Reading Grades, one for the total points of the project, and the other reading grade is from the Accelerated Reader Quiz Score. The students will also get a writing grade.









Bedhead Ted by Scott SanGiacomo

A graphic novel about wanting to fit in when you stand out, friendships, and uncovering the truth of a local urban legend - the elusive giant raccoon known as the Brookside Beast! For the first time, Ted wonders if his unruly hair is a gift rather than a curse.



Better with Butter by Victoria Piontek

Afraid of everything, Marvel, finds an unlikely friend -- and emotional support animal -- in the form of an adorable fainting goat. Everything is easier for her with Butter by her side. But what will happen to Marvel when Butter's owner shows up to take her back? Will Marvel find a way to keep her friend?



The Curse on Spectacle Key by Chantel Acevedo

A Cuban American boy who befriends a pair of spirits and tries to break the curse on his island home . . . only to discover a seemingly lost piece of his family's history in the process.



Glitch by Laura Martin

Night Frights: The Haunted Mustache by Jo McGee
